



I write in September 2021. This month marks twenty years since 9/11 the terrible events of that day in 2001 changed the world forever.

I remember watching the TV in disbelief and shock that day as events unfolded, and I will never forget what happened. But 9/11 is not within living memory of the young people of our youth group DOTs 9/11 brought with it an aftermath of fear and confusion and a rise in fundamentalism, racism and prejudice that we are still faced with today.

DOTs are currently working towards Peace Mala accreditation .

Peace Mala is a multi-award -winning project for peace that Pain Evans began in 2001 whilst working as Head of the Department of Religious Studies in Coedcae School, Llanelli.

Pam says - "I soon realised that our local community had not escaped the aftermath of September 11th 2001. Islamaphobia and racist taunts had become common place in our school. The local mosque suffered a racist attack. Within the same year, the synagogue in Swansea was desecrated."

Peace Mala focuses on the Golden Rule. Its intention is to educate and remind everyone that this rule is recognised by many scholars, teachers and philosophers. It is also universal to all compassionate faiths. Simply stated, it is:

"Treat others as you would wish them to treat you."

As our young people strive to live out the message of the Peace Mala, we hope it is something the whole community would strive to embrace.



DOTs Fund-raising for Toilet Twinning






DOTs Church in Wales Youth group is Peace
Mala accredited. Peace Mala encourages the
youth group to raise awareness of issues of
global interdependence and encourages
active compassion by young people that will
lead to positive changes locally and globally.
Recently we have been learning about Toilet
Twinning. The group were surprised to learn
that 1.7 billion people don't have somewhere
safe to go to the toilet and about the impact
this has on health and education.

Anwen (aged 10) reports "On Thursday 17th November DOTs sold cakes and tea and you could play games like chicken poo bingo, pass the parcel with toilet facts and guess how many sheets on a toilet roll. In total we raised £120 to help people with no toilets." The money raised has supported the construction of toilets in the Democratic Republic of Congo and Uganda.



"We lost 46 family members in the Holocaust that I'm aware of, so it always feels poignant when we light our Menorah; but also hoping and praying for a peaceful future for our next generations"

27th October 2022 DOTs learned more about hate crime with Zoom session with the Sophie Lancaster Foundation.

Sophie Lancaster was a young woman who was murdered for being different. She and her boyfriend were creative, artistic people who dressed in their own unique way. They were attacked by a gang of five boys in a park in Bacup, Lancashire on 11 August 2007. The gang attacked Sophie's boyfriend first and then turned on her, carrying out a brutal and sustained attack. Sophie





remained in hospital for 13 days, before following medical advice, the family agreed to life support being switched off. Sophie died on 24 August 2007; she was just 20 years old.

Sophie's mother, Sylvia, had seen at first-hand the abuse and prejudice her daughter had previously been subjected to, because of how she dressed. During the long hours at hospital, Sylvia decided that when Sophie was better, they would go into schools and talk to young people about difference, and how it is ok to be who you are and express yourself in your own way. Sadly, Sylvia never got a chance to do this with Sophie.

Sylvia was determined that she would carry on this work and The Sophie Lancaster Foundation was established as a lasting legacy to a beautiful life cut short by violence. The charity works to promote tolerance and acceptance for others – however we are different, and champions alternative people in our communities. The Foundation's mission to stamp out prejudice hatred and intolerance everywhere, can be summed up in one word.







10th November 2022 DOTs learned about toilet twinning and planned an event to raise money to twin the second toilet at Llanpumsaint Church.














Message Stick

<u>DOTs Youth Group report by Emma Clift (this was published in our Village News letter Village Voice Dec 2021)</u>

On Saturday, the 23rd of October, we went to Skanda Vale as part of our Peace Mala Accreditation journey. We all arrived at 11 o' clock in the morning and stayed until 3pm. We were welcomed by Brother Francis and we learnt some of the history of Skanda Vale. It was bought in 1973 by Guru Sri Subramanium of Sri Lanka as a 22acre farm. Today Skanda Vale is over 300 acres, as well as having the Skanda Vale hospice at Saron. Over the years the farm has been home to deer, buffalo, peacocks, parrots and many more. In 1982, Skanda Vale welcomed a young elephant named Valli all the way from Sri Lanka. Valli is now over forty years old. Three years ago, another elephant was re-homed there. She is another female elephant named Lakshmi. After an interesting talk by Brother Francis, we walked up through the winding woodland road. First we visited the Guru's grave and memorial statue. It was the Guru's wish was to be buried on that site. After paying our respects, we made our way towards the Maha Shakti temple, formerly a separate smallholding named Pengarn. We passed a few beautiful brown deer in the small paddock and there were a few chickens roaming around. We passed the old enclosure where Valli used to live, having a few years ago outgrown it and moved to larger accommodation. We waited for the elephants to return from their walk and then were allowed in to the enclosure to see them and feed them. We fed them some chopped bananas,





apples and melons. Hand feeding an elephant was a new experience for many of us.

Following this experience, we re- traced our steps back down to the Subramanium temple. We were very privileged to be able to sit inside the temple for the "pooja" as many people had to sit outside in marquees and watch virtually. It was a very spiritual experience for us all, but also very educational to learn about their way of living. We were then invited for a meal of curry and rice, followed by a lovely cup of tea. After a visit to the shop, we said good-bye. We all enjoyed our visit to Skanda Vale and would like to thank everyone there for their warm welcome.

Wedi ymweld a'r siop, dywedon hwyl fawr. Roeddwn wedi mwynhau ein hymweliad a hoffem ddiolch i bawb yn Skanda Vale am y croeso cynnes.





5th June 2022


DOTs joined our friends at Llanllawddog Church for jubilee celebrations with a quiz on music from 1950s to present day.









23/6/22 We carried out a grave yard scavenger hunt learning about the significance of symbols used on memorial stones.

7/10/22 DOTs attended, mixed with people of all ages and helped run activities at the Llanpumsaint Church Harvest Supper.






26th Jan 2023 – We made God's Eyes











A God's eye (in Spanish, Ojo de Dios) is a spiritual and votive object made by weaving a design out of yarn upon a wooden cross. Often several colours are used. They are commonly found in Mexican, Peruvian people and Latin American communities, among both Indigenous and Catholic peoples.

Ojos de Dios are common in the Pueblos of New Mexico. Often they reflect a confidence in all-seeing Providence.

AREA SIX

Suggested Actions

With Peace Mala the youth group encourages Peace Education by forming a Youth Peace Council and engaging in peace activities.

Suggested Actions

Youth Peace Council, Valentine Peace Project, UN International Day of Peace, make a peace garden with prayer tree or labyrinth, Sessions in meditation/stilling exercises (see guide to the Peace Mala), Community Peace Box, Peace Mala Pilgrimage, Using the Peace Mala to pray for world peace (Peace Mala booklet of Peace Prayers), One Day One Day Choir.

The youth group does not need to engage with all of the above. We would, however, expect them to work with at least two peace initiatives.

Then look at the red petals: red reminds us of danger and harm. Ask God to be close to those who are still facing danger each day, to give courage to the armed forces, and compassion to all who help others.

Place your whole hand over the poppy: poppies are also fragile and need to be handled gently. God cares for those who are hurting and those who are sad. Ask God to comfort all who are grieving the loss of someone they love.

Finally place a finger on the centre of the poppy: ask God to help you play your part in working for peace in the world.






A Prayer for Ukraine
